Main Street Matters

Our Town Foundation is excited about the future of Hamburg's downtown with a resurgence of new businesses and opportunities for residents and visitors. Recently, Pennsylvania passed the State's Main Street Matters program which is bringing additional funding opportunities to small towns. We are completing the necessary steps and will be submitting our application for redesignation as a Main Street Program in order to bring this support to Hamburg. Main Street Programs use a comprehensive, community-based approach to revitalizing downtowns and central business districts, which has been applied across the United States since the early '80s. We have found success as a designated program in the past and see a great need for this approach to continue in Hamburg.

Main Street Matters offers downtowns and commercial districts targeted investment and development for a period of five years. Nonprofit organizations like Our Town Foundation, as well as other economic development focused organizations, are eligible to apply for designation to carry out the goals of the program. The program focuses on these four areas of community development; Economic Vitality, Design, Organization, and Promotions. The program promotes preserving and strengthening existing retail, local government, and business centers of communities, improving the quality of life in a community by making traditional downtown areas a more attractive place to live and work, working with Main Street businesses to find opportunities for business growth, and other goals to improve and develop economic opportunities in town.

The qualifications for this selective program are extensive and include a five-year strategy, sustainability plan, resolution of support from the local municipality, a designated staff to implement the program, regular reporting, and a focus on historic preservation, among other requirements. OTF started the application process earlier this year with a survey and public visioning sessions to assess the current status of the town and hear feedback from residents and businesses in order to determine goals for the town and form a strategy for the future. OTF continues to gather the necessary information for application and plans to apply before the deadline in November.

This designation will have a huge impact on OTF and Hamburg as it will give the organization the necessary resources to carry out important economic development goals for the town based on the feedback from people who live and work in Hamburg. State Street Square

Our Town Foundation is getting closer and closer to completing our development project at State Street Square and can't wait to invite the community to special events held there. Due to grant funding and local community support we were able to complete the exterior of the building. At the Taste of Hamburg-er Festival, Classic Rock group, Mere Image, played the first ever song on the completed stage!

We are now moving into our next step of construction which includes finishing the interior of the building with bathrooms, kitchen, and a storage area. Our goal is to have these items completed by spring, 2025. We received a grant in the amount of \$35,382 from the Commonwealth Financing Authority's Local Share Account program to help cover the costs of the plumbing fixtures which will kick start this phase. We also applied for a grant in the amount of \$25,000 through Berks County's Greenways, Parks and Recreation Program to assist with purchasing the kitchen equipment and should know if our application was approved in the very near future. However, with construction and equipment costs rising, we are still in need of donations to get us to the finish point. H&B Site Services, LLC was founded to provide streamlined testing services to developers for their land development and subdivision projects throughout the State of Pennsylvania. We specialize in stormwater infiltration testing, which is a necessary component in preliminary planning for land development projects where stormwater management is of concern. Comprehensive reports are generated from testing in the field to provide our

clients' engineers with important information about the sites underlying soils and the rate at which water passes through the soil, known as the infiltration rate. This information is critical in an engineer's design process for appropriate sizing and placement of Stormwater Best Management Practices (BMPs). Stormwater BMPs include infiltration basins, raingardens, vegetated swales, and other methods of stormwater control. Stormwater management is an integral part of any large land development or subdivision project, but may also be required for smaller residential projects based upon a municipality's ordinances regarding stormwater management. Completing infiltration testing early on in the design process of a site is important to provide engineers with the information they need to accurately design and size stormwater BMPs and to meet stormwater management requirements of the municipality in which they are working in, as well as the requirements set in place by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP).

In addition to performing infiltration testing, H&B Site Services also provides shallow excavation services to dig the test pits for soil investigation. Test pits help to determine any limiting zones that are present in the underlying soil (such as bedrock or a highwater table) that may limit the rate at which water moves through the soil. By providing excavation services in conjunction with infiltration testing, the testing process is streamlined for our clients, who often have to seek out a separate excavator for digging the needed test pits. H&B Site Services also offers percolation testing for determining general site suitability and aiding in the design of on-lot septic systems.

Branden Bialek is the president of H&B Site Services, and has over 8 years of experience in stormwater management design and implementing infiltration test results. He attended Wilkes University and obtained a bachelor's degree in environmental engineering in 2017. Since then, he has worked at a local firm as a civil engineer, where he has assisted in stormwater management designs for many projects ranging from residential single-family homes to larger commercial development sites. He is also a certified PA Sewage Enforcement Officer (SEO). Branden resides in Lenhartsville, PA and has performed work throughout southeastern Pennsylvania, but has provided testing and excavation services as far as the Pittsburgh area.
