Building a Thriving Business Community

The small-town charm of Hamburg is the lifeblood of its local businesses, and efforts are underway to make it an even stronger destination for commerce and community. Hamburg business owners are encouraged to take part and lend their voices to this effort. Uncle Joe's History Farm 525 Mountain View Drive, Hamburg

Uncle Joe's History Farm is a relatively new business in the Hamburg area, and one you definitely want to check out with your family as a unique and educational attraction designed to take visitors on a journey through time. Uncle Joe's History Farm provides an enriching experience that connects the present with the past. You will have a peek into what life on the farm was like over a hundred years ago. It is fascinating to see how people used their inventive abilities to solve many laborintensive activities using hit-n-miss engines to operate farm implements.



Owner, Joe Tetz, was raised on a dairy farm and had his own automotive machine shop. He was always mechanical and is passionate about history. He collected antique equipment at his farm in New Tripoli and held open houses for people to view his collection. Joe and his wife, Joan, moved to Hamburg eight years ago from New Tripoli and started the History Farm three years ago. Joe combines his mechanical skills and passion for history at his farm to share how things worked back at the turn of the 20th Century. He says, "I think we are losing our history from where we started from and I want to show as many people as possible how it was from 1880 -1930."



What makes Uncle Joe's History Farm special? It is not a museum where you just walk through and look at everything. When you are at the farm, you actually see how everything works. It is where history comes alive. According to Joe, "We are different because we actually operate the equipment and demonstrate it running." The farm showcases demonstrations of early 1900 farm equipment and has all the antique equipment to show the specific processes including an antique rope braid-

er, the first rotary well driller driven by a horse, antique grain equipment, a coffee huller for coffee beans, and a rock crusher, to name a few. Demonstrations include how to make butter and cider, how to process wood, how to grind wheat and corn, and more. Located in the countryside, you can stroll through the rose gardens and watch the birds and the bees in the perennial garden. Visitors can also enjoy a relaxing water feature. Joe is proud to share this with the community.

All are welcome to visit and learn about this special history. The farm is ideal for day trips for history enthusiasts, car clubs, granges, senior centers, and more. Uncle Joe's History Farm caters to homeschool and Mennonite school groups. Other groups, small and large, with a maxi-



mum of about 50 people, are welcome. The farm's hours of operation are currently by appointment only. Call 484-221-0172 to book a visit. Cost is \$10 per person. their www.antiquepowerpa.com or their Facebook page for scheduled live demonstrations.

A Year in Review

Our Town Foundation held it's Annual Meeting on February 12th to report on highlights of the past year and to elect the 2025 Board of Directors. Two new board members were elected to serve a three year term; Branden Bialek of H&B Site Services and Ernesto Salgado, local realtor with Coldwell Bankers. Four directors stepped down due to term limits which were recently enacted with a change in the organization's bylaws. Those directors were Jeremy Hoagland and Stephanie Menapace, both who served since 2019, Cindy Blefgen who served since 2017, and Stephanie Adam who served since 2010. The Foundation thanks all four directors for their time served over the past several years.

While reviewing the report, it was noted that 2,993 hours of volunteer time were recorded in 2024, equaling a total of \$93,680 in labor costs, as per government statistics on the value of volunteers. It was also noted that these were only the hours that have been recorded by the volunteers and there are many more hours that volunteers fail to report.

Other points of interest included the number and value of the grants the organization received in 2024 which included:

- ♦ \$98,287 awarded by the Commonwealth Finance Authority to purchase new seats and flooring for the Strand Theater
- \$35,382 awarded by the Commonwealth Finance Authority to purchase plumbing fixtures for the State Street Square project
- ♦ \$15,000 from the M & T Charitable Foundation for the State Street Square patio
- ♦ \$10,000 from the Berks County Community Foundation to assist with expenses incurred during our revisioning meetings and re-designation application
- ♦ \$5,000 from Niagara Cares Grant for assistance with the State Street Square construction
- ♦ \$5,000 from Berks County to assist with the expense of finishing the concession area of the State Street Square project

During the past year, the staff spent many weeks gathering information about the town, hosting public visioning sessions, meeting with consultants, and preparing an application to be considered for re-designation as a Main Street program through the PA Department of Community and Economic Development. The application was submitted in November, and we hope to hear by April if we were approved. If approved, we will receive funding from the state to once again pay for a full time staff position that will focus on improving the downtown business district.

During 2024 the Foundation continued to promote the town and community events to the general public. 34 email newsletters were sent to over 3,000 subscribers, four articles were submitted to the Commerce Quarterly magazine which is published by the Greater Reading Chamber Alliance, four OTF newsletters were distributed, articles were placed in the Borough's newsletters, and all of our social media accounts saw an increase in followers.

The Hamburg Strand Theater had another banner year, screening 32 first run movies, 31 special movies, and one live performance. There were a total of 18,810 movie tickets sold this year, an increase of 1,949 over the previous year. In addition, there were 61 private parties held at the theater as it remains an affordable place to host birthday parties and other celebrations.

The Arts Alliance component of the organization was quite busy in 2024 as well. In addition to managing the Art & Craft Gallery, they hosted/participated in eight arts related events, including the annual Bingo, Beer and Bar-BQ, Hawk Mountain Arts Tour and Sale, a progressive dinner fundraiser, a wine and cheese reception in the Gallery of Hamburg, and an Arts Alliance membership picnic. They also offered 23 public art classes, and hosted four featured artists receptions in the Gallery.

The Foundation was also busy organizing other events and activities for the public's enjoyment. In addition to the annual Taste of Hamburg-er Festival which attracted approximately 30,000 people to the town, they organized several networking mixers and ribbon cuttings at local businesses, Shop Small Saturday, and participated in the annual garden tour. The organization also managed the Hamburg Community Garden which provides fifteen garden beds for residents to rent.


Volunteer of the Year

Hamburg Strand Theater News


The Strand is planning renovations to take place this summer! Thanks to a \$98,287 grant from the Local Share Account Program administered through the PA Commonwealth Financing Authority, the theater will be replacing the seating and flooring in the theater. Unfortunately, due to rising costs, the funding is not sufficient to cover the entire expense of the project. Therefore, we have started a "CHAIR"-ity fundraiser to help fund the remaining costs.

We are so excited for these upgrades as they are long overdue. The existing seats were installed over 30 years ago and they were purchased used at that time. While we would love to salvage the flooring, it is beyond repair. It is the original wood flooring which was installed over 100 years ago! Stay tuned for updates on the dates of renovations and theater closures, which are tentatively scheduled for June.






